Mark Your Calendar

The three big fishing events for May are: the opening of Ling Cod season on May 1st; Halibut opening on May 7th and finally Spot Shrimp opening on May 14th for the Puget Sound/San Juan area. With all the negative news about the 2016 Puget Sound salmon fishing season, there is still plenty of fishing and catching to be done without much imagination in this region.

Consistently Catching Ling Cod

Ling Cod and Halibut are my favorite two fish to catch. I believe many of you agree that fresh Ling Cod is the best tasting fish to come from the sea.

The Ling Cod fishing season opening every year on May 1st in Puget Sound is what gets the ball rolling. This is the time when boats come out of storage and we start taking inventory of our fishing tackle (if we can find it) left over from last year.

You would think that a large body of water like Puget Sound would have rock piles overflowing with Ling Cod - not so. Most of Puget Sound is deep and full of glacial mud and sand deposited during the last Ice Age. There are a few natural rock or man-made piles in Puget Sound. They are scattered throughout the Sound and might not be convenient for you to get to unless you live near one of these areas.

A short list of places for Ling Cod fishing in Puget Sound:

Artificial reef at Hat Island (Gedney Island)

Possession Bar

Artificial reef at Possession Bar

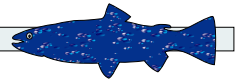
Double Bluff

Breakwater around Edmonds Marina

Breakwater around Shilshole Marina

Foul Weather Bluff

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There are a number of other Ling Cod fishing areas throughout the Sound that might be a personal favorite.

These are two methods for catching Ling Cod:

live bait
plastic worms on lead head jigs.

The three primary live baits for catching Ling Cod are: Live Rock Sole (flounders), Sculpins and small Pile Perch (Poggies). Rock Sole can be caught just about anywhere in Puget Sound that has a sandy bottom. They can be found in 65 to 100 feet of water. These fish are fairly easy to catch. If you mess up catching Rock Sole, you need to find another hobby. Here is how you rig up for catching Sole: slide a Slydo onto the fishing line and then tie a #7-barrel swivel onto the end of the line. Tie a short leader with a #6 worm hook on 10-pound leader material. The best bait for catching Sole is small pieces of squid. Even though Sole will bite on anything that you send to the bottom, Squid will stay on the hook better than most other baits since it is so tough. Once you let the bait to the bottom, the trick to catching Sole is to hold the fishing rod as still as possible. Don't jerk the rod when you start getting a bite. Let the Sole hook himself. Don't be aggressive, these fish will hook themselves and the job will get done sooner if you can show some patience. For three anglers, you will need 12 to 15 flounder for a day of fishing. Keep the Sole alive by placing them in an ice chest and pouring five gallons of water in the ice chest every hour or use an aerator. Sculpins can be caught while fishing for Rock Sole and are the ultimate Ling Cod bait. It

would be nice if they could be caught in larger quantities during Ling Cod season.

Small Pile Perch can be caught in and around most pilings in Puget Sound. They are also found in many of the marinas here in the Sound. If available, you see them around pilings and under the docks. Pile Perch can be caught on herring/smelt jigs. The #4 Gamakatsu Herring jig with fish skin (without glow beads) is the best jig to use for catching Pile Perch.

The next question is, "how to hook-up live bait now that you caught them?" Here is one Ling Cod rig I like: tie a double hook rig with a 5/0 black Gamakatsu Circle hook and a 6/0 black Gamakatsu Octopus hook. The Circle hook should be the top hook. Tie the hooks three inches apart on 30-pound test leader material. The leader length should be no longer than 30 inches. If you make it longer, it will get tangled around the line when you are letting the rig to the bottom.

Here is the complete rig from the line to the leader: put a large Slydo on the fishing line. Next tie a #5 black barrel swivel on the end of the line. Tie the leader to the other end of the swivel. Now snap a 4 to 6-ounce cannon ball lead to the Slydo.

Gently grab a live bait and insert the circle hook through the inside of the mouth of the fish and out through the top of the head. Now I am going to give you the best tip ever on keeping the live fish on the hook. Once the live fish is on the hook, take a Buzz Bomb bumper and slide the bumper over

the tip of the hook until it rests against the live bait. This Buzz Bomb bumper will prevent live fish from wiggling off the hook and that saves on bait and keeps you fishing.

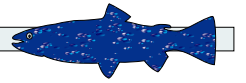

Now let me give you a practical tip on rigging tackle for Ling Cod fishing. Ling Cod are called rock fish for one simple reason - they live in a very rocky environment. Because of this environment it lends itself to being a tackle grabber. If you are going fishing all day, bring at least three complete rigs per angler.

Fishing with live bait is not as easy as letting the bait to the bottom and waiting for a Ling Cod to jump on the hooks. This is a technique that will put a limit of Lings in the boat if you have patience. When Ling Cod go after a live bait they want to eat, they do so with some suspicion. Most often they will initially try to stun the bait. If you strike during this phase of the bite, you will most likely never hook-up a Ling and get him in. Let the Ling get comfortable with the fact that the bait is the real deal. Eventually the biting Ling will grab the bait and try to take it back to the bottom. Do not strike at this phase of the bite. Wait until the Ling is taking line off the

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reel. Now start slowly reeling and the Ling will get hooked-up.

Ling Fishing with Plastic Baits

Fishing with artificial baits for Ling Cod can never go out of style. They are easy to use and can be very productive. There are two types of plastic baits considered worth purchasing for Ling Cod fishing: 6-inch Twin Tail Scampi's and Hoky 5 inch Flounders. Twin Tail Scampi come in a variety of colors. If I were to pick out a couple Scampi Tails colors for Ling fishing I would choose motor oil with red flake or black with silver flake. The Scampi tails need to be paired up with 4 or 6-ounce lead head jigs. Hoky Flounder can be rigged exactly how I earlier described for using a real Rock Sole.

The technique for using Scampi Tails and Hoky Flounders is to make them look like live swimming fish. In other words, don't radically jig the baits which is not natural. There is nothing swimming near the bottom that is jumping around like a rabbit on steroids. Gently swim the baits so that they mimic a live swimming fish. The whole trick is to make the artificial bait look like a live natural swimming bait that could be a potential Ling Cod meal.

This is where things become tricky if you have not fished for Ling Cod. A Ling Cod will always grab the artificial bait on the down-stroke of the rod. If you are waiting for a massive strike, give me a call when you are tired of fishing. The trick while jigging is to watch the fishing line at all times. When a Ling picks up the artificial bait

the fishing line will go limp, then strike hard with your fishing rod and crank hard on the reel. Don't take any chances if you remotely think a Ling has picked up the bait.

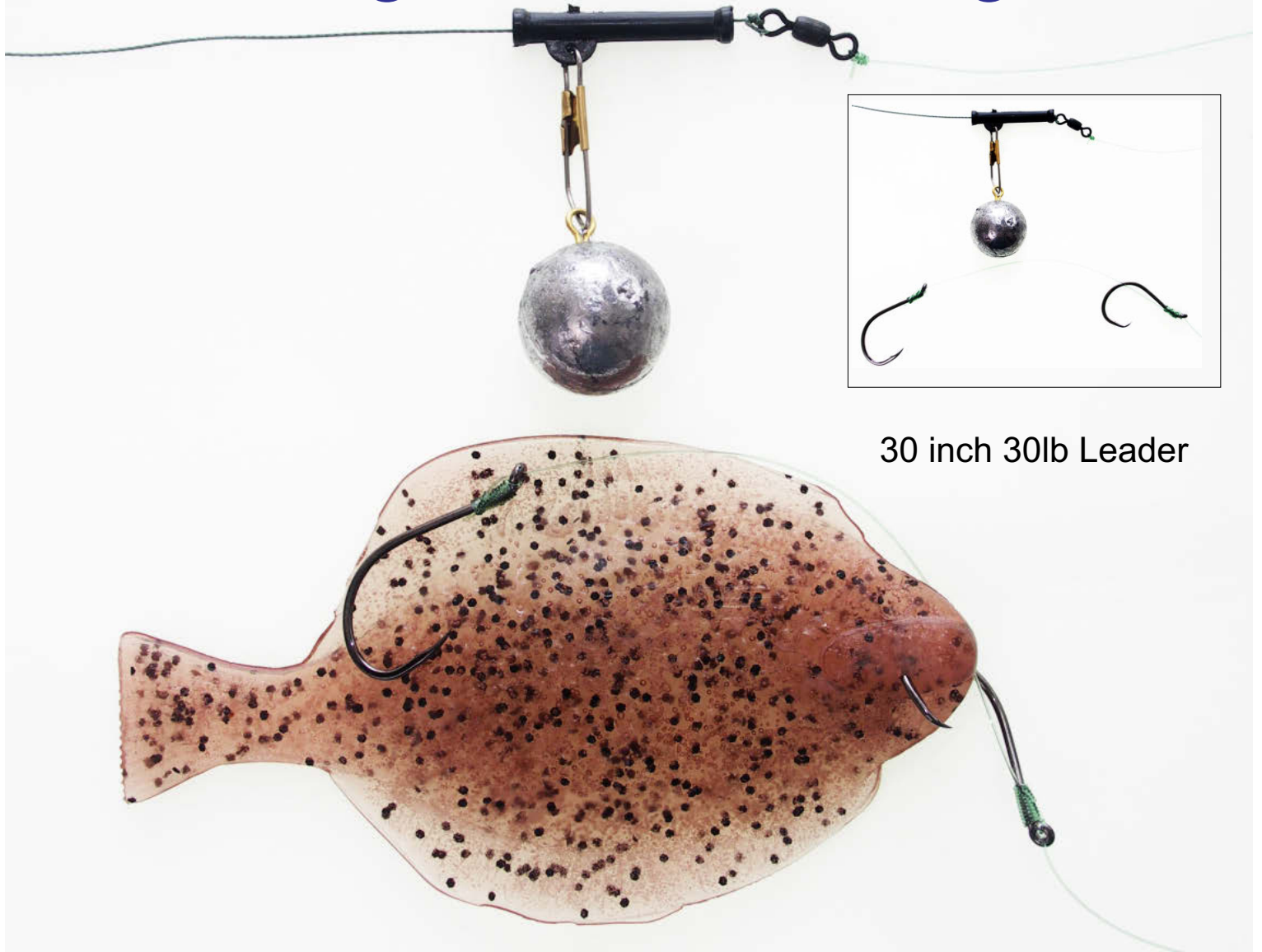

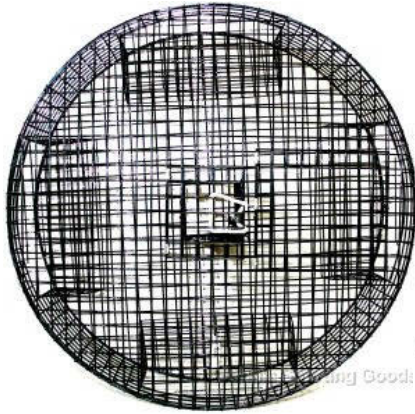

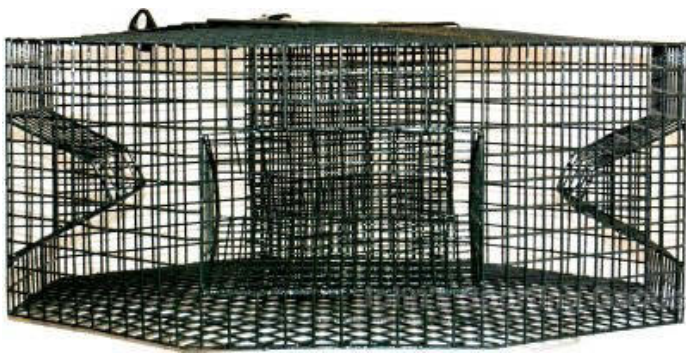
